Equipment Use: What's Acceptable Vs. Non-Acceptable?

Pool noodles being used safely and under adult supervision. Not to be used as flotation devices.



We do not allow use of PFD's unless medically necessary w/ doctor's note



Kickboards while lap swimming.



Floats that are not part of a sanctioned event.



Pool buoys while lap swimming



Animal floats are for LTS only.



Barbells are not for use by children. They are available for responsible adult use only. Water belts are for adult use only.



"Water wings" are not allowed.



Dive rings and wet pets can be used under adult supervision.



Inflatable ball use and water gun use is not permitted outside of sanctioned events.

Mermaid tails are not permitted



Abbreviated Pool Rules

- Proper swim attire is required and is at the discretion of staff.
- Non-disposable swim diapers are required for all children not toilet trained
- Pool schedule is subject to change
- Children under the age of 11 years of age must be accompanied in the facility by a parent or guardian
- Children under the age of 8 must be physically accompanied in the water by an adult or guardian
- Management reserves the right to close the pool at any time.
 Furthermore, management reserves the right to eject any patron at any time for any reason they deem necessary.
- Personal floatation devices are not allowed
- Food, glass, tobacco products, narcotics, or alcoholic beverages are not allowed
- Children under the age of 6 are permitted to use either locker room with adult supervision
- Private swim lessons are not allowed at any time unless it is a sanctioned program
- Use of any media device is prohibited while using our aquatics facilities

Refunds on admission fees will not be given



Code of Conduct

The safety of pool patrons and staff is the top priority of the Bristol Parks, Recreation, youth and Community Services Department (BPRYCS). Pool patrons are expected to adhere to all posted pool rules and follow directions of department staff at all times. In the event that rule violations occur progressive discipline will be followed in order to provide patrons the opportunity to correct behaviors.

However, BPRYCS has a zero tolerance policy for the following behaviors:

- 1. Physical or verbal fighting
- 2. Overt disrespect of BPRYCS staff
- 3. Abuse or intentional damage of any BPRYCS equipment or property
- 4. Theft or vandalism
- 5. Trash talking, taunting or verbal intimidation, and foul language
- 6. Illegal drug use
- 7. Inappropriate activity of a sexual nature
- 8. Any action interfering with the ability of the staff to provide a safe, family environment

Violations of these policies will result in immediate ejection from the facility. Depending on the severity of the incident repercussions may include suspension and/or Bristol Police Department involvement.
